ST MARYS CHURCH

is a beautiful medieval church and should not be missed. It has a lovely organ and stained glass windows as well as paintings and carvings of animals including the inspiration for Lewis Carroll's White Rabbit.

A TOWN OF HISTORY

705-718

A monastery is founded by Beaver lake (lacum). John (of Beverley), Bishop of Hexham, made Bishop of York and visited the Beverley area during his missionary journeys, healing the sick and retired to his own monastery in the wood of Deira generally thought to have been the first Beverley Minster.

721

John of Beverley is buried at the monastery.

867

The Minster was probably destroyed by the Vikings.

1037

John is canonised and pilgrims came to visit his tomb. As a result, a town grows up at Beverley.

п88

The town of Beverley and the Minster suffered a disastrous fire. 1213

The Minster's central tower collapsed as a result of an attempt to heighten it, causing serious damage to the eastern arm of the church.

1220>1270

GREAT REBUILDING OF THE MINSTER STARTS FOLLOWING THE DISASTER OF C.1213.

Dominican friars (black friars) arrive in Beverley.

Beverley Today

Beverley has featured in The Sunday Times list of the ten most desirable locations to live in Yorkshire and the North East. An accolade first picked up in the 14th century when it was in the top 10 most important towns in England and was extremely important for its brick. tile, leather and cloth industry.

Beverley continues to improve as a highly desirable, interesting town to visit and the old is being incorporated into the new: the old picture playhouse is now an impressive department store. The Friary is home to a youth hostel, a 100 year old disused chapel was converted and is now home to East Riding Theatre. An 18C building on Beckside that closed as The Travellers Rest Ale House in 1925 recently came back

to life as a coffee shop and deli, and a brand new leisure/ retail development is situated on the site of what once was Hodgson's Tannery.

Beverley Filming

Beverley Minster doubled for scenes in the ITV Drama Victoria. The church, which is thought to offer the best resemblance to Westminster Abbev. was used for the filming of coronation scenes.BBC One drama series Gunpowder was also filmed on location at Beverley Minster in 2017.

East Riding Theatre

- doubled as the drill hall and Captain Mainwaring's office in the 2016 Dad's Army movie.

The Guildhall provided the location for a courtroom in Death Comes to Pemberley, a P D James novel, filmed in 2013.


